It got here about two days after it was mailed. I wrote dad a letter as soon as I could but didn't have any air mail stamps.

I havn't received the papers yet but suppose they will be here in a few days. I always enjoy reading them.

Am glad you got to make the trip to Jamestown. Hope Uncle Nevin is getting along better. Have you ever been to see Uncle Henry since the time we were out there? I sure would like to see him.

Bill said dad bought a '36 Chevy. Guess it runs lots better than the '31.

I would like to come home for a visit but will have to wait 15 mo. for that. am getting along ok though - moved to the radio bunk house last week. don't have much to do. one of the fellows here at the station transferred to the signal corps last week and that's why I moved in before I expected to. The

fellow who is going back to the States next mo.
has a 5th class specialists rating (\$6. extra) and
I will probably get that when he leaves. I
think I will be able to save some money.
Another fellow and I ordered a transmitter from
Montgomery Ward today. were paying \$7. a month
on it. it should be here some time in Sept.

Hope everybody is ok. Tell them all hello,
write again soon - nice try to answer all
letters as soon as I receive them from now on.
