Dear Alice,

Received your letter ok - sure
was glad to hear from home. I
thought maybe my letter didn't get
there after I waited so long for
an answer. But I guess you
are all pretty busy there. —
I suppose Russell and Bill
are having a tough time fighting
fires and doing any work
on the farm. — They will
probably have to quit that
job when they have to start
plowing etc. — I would like
to be there to help them — I'd
rather work on a farm any
time than to be here in the Army.

The Army is a lot different than it was when I was in before. at least it is different here. There is a lot of Reserve officers on active duty now and they don't seem to know their business -- we havn't been paid yet and nobody knows when they are going to pay us. I am broke and have to borrow a stamp to mail this. -- The Sint in this outfit gave me a job sweeping out officers tents and making up their bunks. I have about 18 tents to take care of - I will do it for a few days but that's all. If they can't find something

better than that for me to do I'll ask for a discharge from the Reserves and reenlist in the regular army and go to Fort Oglethorpe. I don't even like to make up my own bunk much less 18 more for a bunch of officers. —

That was too bad about Mrs. Quinn - I didn't know she was sick. ~~She~~ She was getting pretty old tho. - what are they doing with the store? I think it belonged to Coil but I guess he is in the Army somewhere. He is a Captain.

Well Alice you didn't tell me any news much - How is

everything on the farm? — Oh
about the gasoline motor.

Did they get a new one? if
they did it shouldn't give
them any trouble.

I have been wondering
how the hay and corn is
holding out. guess the corn
is going down pretty fast
with horses, chickens and pigs
to feed. — well I can't think
of anymore to write about.
Hope everybody there is sp.
How is Uncle Henry? — You
told me in your letter that some
of you were going to see him.
