Dear Dorothy,

Sure glad to get your letter. I've received about three since I've been here but havn't been here long enough to get any answers to the ones I've written

I am getting along fine so far - Plenty to eat and a good place to sleep. This country is ok - Of course, on account of the war its nothing like the states. Theres lots of pretty girls here and they seem to like the yanks very well..

Oh yes I was in Washington just before I left - Spent about three hours in town besides several more hours I was out at the army air field. Done some telephoning trying to locate you but didn't have any luck. I sure hated to leave without having seen you.

Nothing I could do about it though... Have been wondering if Clarence had decided to accept the position there in Washington.

Ok about Bill. The last letter I got from him he seemed to think that he wouldnt get to go to Canada. I suppose Russell is in the Service by now. Wonder if he got in the Air Corps.

I told Mama I would send Bernice some money to go to school on - You needn't bother about what I lent you.. I get more than I need here. Think I'll start buying a couple of bonds a month.

By the way, your letter was about ten days on the way. (Might have been less, not sure the exact day it got here.) Not much else to write about so will close. Hope you are getting along ok...Will be looking for another letter from you soon.
