It's been quite a while since I got your letter - Sorry I didn't write sooner. — Congratulations on your promotion. — I got a letter from Edwin Beck and he was telling me about you being there and having dinner with him.

No I don't have the motor-cycle — Not allowed to ride them over here anymore. I'll have to settle for a bicycle I guess. I rode down to a 'Pub' a couple of nights ago. — a 'Pub' is a beer joint. — You asked about the towns around here — there's a few around but transportation is kind of hard to find — I go into London once in a while. They have several nice Red Cross Service Clubs there. London is always crowded.

What sort of a place is Oneonta Ky? Is it the closest town to Camp Beckwith? I don't know much about Ky — about the only town I've been in is Stearns.

Ok on your code speed. You can copy fast enough to get a license - You ought to take the exam after the war and we will go in together and put a 1 kw. rig on the air - I haven't done any operating for several months but we have a receiver in the shop that I use to copy for practice -

Well Russell there's not much else to write about - Do you ever hear from any of the boys - J.H. - Billie or David? - The folks told me that David had gone overseas - Do you think you will be leaving the States soon? I guess Bill is having a lonesome time up in Alaska - I think it stays daylight all night up there - hi - - It doesn't get dark here till about eleven o'clock -
