I have been transferred again - still doing the same work tho.

I got a letter from Richard Pemberton and he was telling me about there being a lot of new fish in the river when he was home. He said he was anxious for the time to come when he could go fishing again with some of the old gang. - From what you told me about your fishing trip awhile back I bet you had a good time. There's a place not so far from here that is supposed to be a pretty good for fishing.

Richard is working in Ohio for G. E. I think there's about 2000 women working at the same place. He said that there was all kinds - fat ones - skinny ones some pretty and some ugly but that he hadn't caught one yet -

Ok about Gerald Hood - I wrote
to him but haven't had time to get
an answer - Hope I can get to
see him soon - - By the way I
ran across an old buddy who worked
in the radio Sta. in Panama with me.
we both got passed and spent a day
in London - Sure enjoyed talking over
old times with him - He is a Sgt.
in another Bomb. Group.

Say Russell do you know Jack Samanec
He has been stationed at this place
for several months and I just met up
with him a few days ago. He knows Bill
and used to run around with him.

Well I'm going to try to write a
letter to the folks at home tonight -
Hope you are still doing Ok - Write
as soon as you can and let me
know how the Terr. Maneuvers come
