afternoon.

I would like to go with you to Big Clear-
creek fishing. Have a good time.

I don't buy enough brown cows to
save the wrappers. They probably sell
a different brand here anyway.

We got up earlier than usual this morning. Got up about 4:15. We had exercise about five o'clock. We have to march out in the ball diamond without our shirts and I nearly froze to death this morning.

I have to go on guard at four o'clock this afternoon. I will be on until four tomorrow afternoon.
