I certainly hope you can come out before long. Remember that I will only be here about three more months, maybe a little under that.

If you ~~don't~~ do make the trip here is a little dope on when I can see you. We have open post every weekend from 3 PM Saturday until 2 AM Sunday - then from 5 AM Sunday until 8 PM. During open post we can go anywhere in Fayetteville.

I will mail ~~up~~ my picture to you this week. Hope you like it.

I had a letter from Hurst just before he left the states. I wrote him immediately but haven't ~~had~~ received any answer.

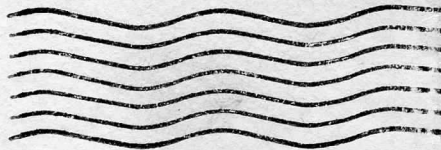
