I'm sorry that I haven't written you very often - will try to do better. Please excuse this fancy ink - I am using a borrowed pen. Did I tell you I had a Parker 51 stolen from me just before leaving Fayetteville? Haven't been able to find another one.

What kind of work is Jewell doing at Sequachie? I don't even know where that is. How far from home is it? Glad to hear that all the girls can be home during my furlough. Unless my plans fail I will be home about July 25<sup>th</sup> or 26<sup>th</sup> and I was permitted to ask for fifteen days, but don't expect to get but six or seven. Tell Dad to oil up the fishing tackle and get ready to catch another big one like that last one he caught. I can just see him reeling in that

bas he caught the last time I was home.  
Sure wish Bill & John could be home. Does  
either one ever mention the possibility  
of a furlough? I don't hear from them very  
often. Had a letter from John dated May 23<sup>rd</sup>.

You asked about the papers I am getting.  
I subscribed for R. Digest about six  
weeks ago. — also still get the County paper.

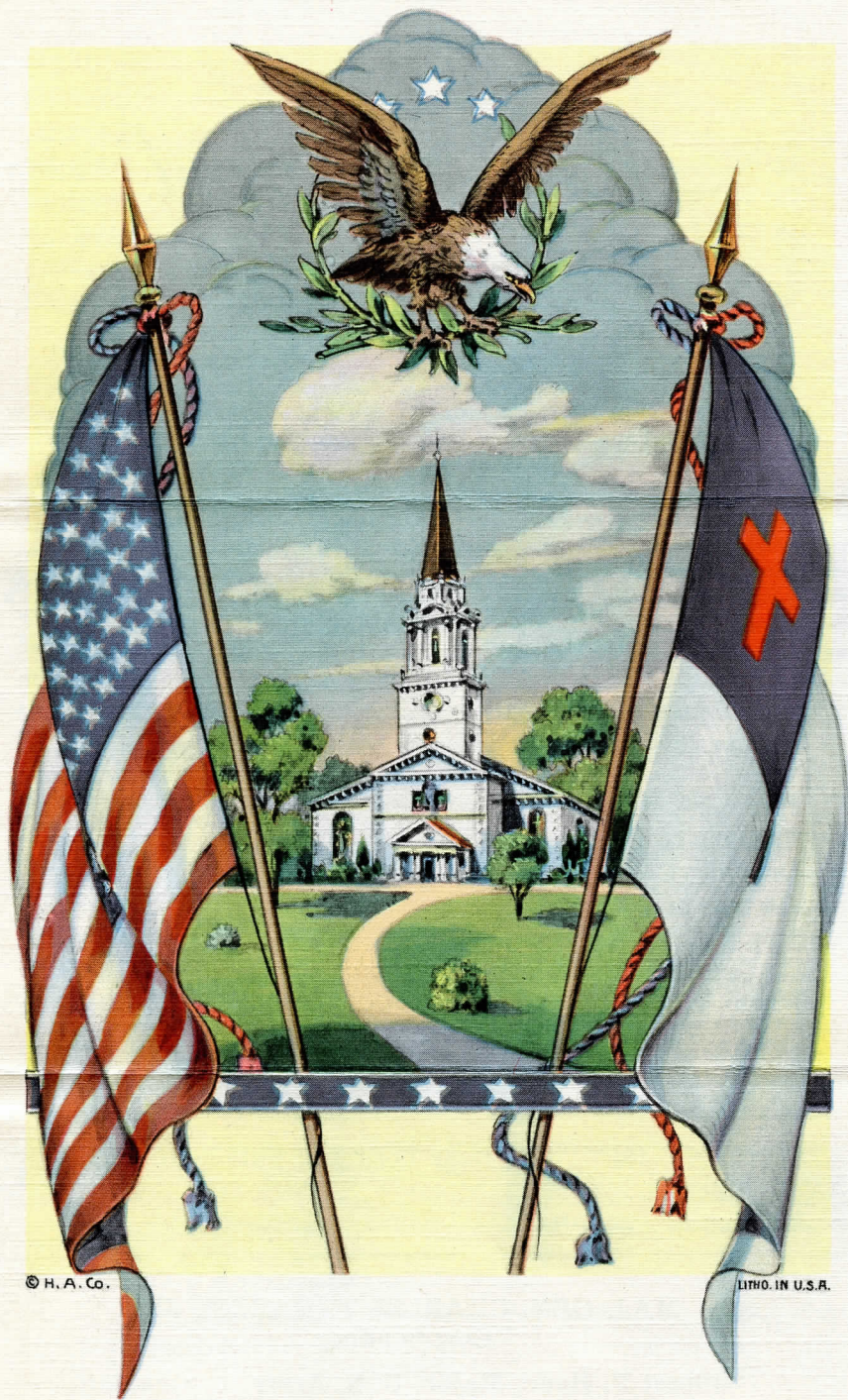
I am now in my third week of
