That sure was a nice letter - are you learning to type by the touch system, or do you still hunt and peck?

You understood what I told you about the bond OK - I'm going to buy another one as soon as that one is paid for - maybe sooner.

Remember the secret you told me? I won't mention it here, but I would like to know more about it - could you tell me anything more?

I've been going to school today - I am learning about Army administration. I have been doing some drilling too, for the first time in weeks. They're going to organize a new regiment here, and they're taking the cadre (non-commissioned)

officers) out of this regiment for the job. I may get in on it - I'm not sure yet. I'll furnish more details in another letter about that.

Well, it is almost time for lights out. Write me again when the nation strikes you - I enjoyed your letter a lot.

Tell everybody hello for me, and tell Jewell I won't have time to write a poetic answer to her lyrics - I'm pretty busy with my training again. I attended a class tonight from 7:00 to 8:30. I'll answer her letter though, and maybe write a verse or two.
