Dear Mama -

Well, I'm in the Army now, have my uniform and all, but I have had very little close order drill. I'm in a good barrack but it is over crowded, and has to be swept and mopped every morning before breakfast and scrubbed once a week. We washed all the windows day before yesterday, and they had us wash them again today. I think we should do more drilling and less wasting - I guess the corporals and sergeants just don't like the hot sun, I'll be kinda glad when I get an assignment.

The man who interviewed me told me I made a good grade on both the I.Q. and mechanical aptitude, and said I stood a good chance for a rating after I got my basic training. I

Have you heard from Russell? I would like to get his address - also Johny's. I know it's McHill Field, but that's all.

Kenneth Jones is a soldier in this camp - he told me he was chalked up for non-combat duty because of his eyes. I've talked with him quite a lot - he showed me some pictures of Uncle Will.

Dorothy was here to see me last Sunday - Harriet (somebody) was with her - I think Harriet is her roommate.

I wrote Bernice when I first came here, but told her to wait until I was stationed to answer. I didn't think I would be at this address this long - I haven't written her any more.
