ing for the rest of the  
school term anyway.

I will have to stop and  
fix dinner. The girls are  
coming home for dinner  
and I want them to  
mail this letter.

I am glad we have  
Bro. Spessard with us  
another year, also the  
same superintendent.  
I will try to help out  
on the pastor's salary  
more this year. Right  
now we are having  
to buy winter underwear  
shoes stockings etc  
for the children. May  
be a little later I  
can send him some.
