The first of the month as I
can leave a little before
Edie leaves me there alone
which will be the 9th of next
month. I expect to start to
Oakdale ~~one~~ week from
next Sunday afternoon

But if you won't be at home
just let me know what
day next week will be alright
and I will see you some
afternoon next week and
if it is alright with you

I will stay over till the
next morning.

nothing happens the folks
haven't seen them for a long
time. Mr & Mrs Stevington
are coming over tomorrow
so I guess we will have a fine
time then. I haven't seen

we went to Rugby it didn't
take us long.

this afternoon she was as

I won't go down there any more

day either when we come to
