the truth about it so that
is all I can promise.

Now about the time when
I will see you again I don't
know what you are going to

be down to see you.

The first of the month as I
can learn a little before
Cold leans me then alone
which will be the 9th of next
month, I expect to start to
Cahdale ~~one~~ week from
next Sunday afternoon
and if you are at home at

But if you won't be at home
just let me know what
day next week will be alright
and I will see you some
afternoon next week and
if it is alright with you

I will stay over till the
next morning.

time at home this week and

nothing happens. The folks
havent been there for a long
time. Mr & Mrs Stensington
are coming over tomorrow
so I guess we will have a fine
